## PREFACE

This Standard was prepared by the Standards Australia Committee ME-026, Industrial Trucks. It is identical with and has been reproduced from ISO 5057:1993, *Industrial trucks—Inspection and repair of fork arms in service on fork-lift trucks*.

The objective of this Standard is to provide manufacturers and operators of fork-lift trucks with methods for the inspection and repair of solid-section fork arms that are in use on all types of fork-lift trucks.
