HAZARDS

FIRE	HIGHLY FLAMMABLE: Will be easily ignited by heat, sparks or flames. Will form explosive mixture with air. Liquid vaporizes readily on release and spreads steadily along the ground. Vapours may travel to source of ignition and flash back. Containers may explode when heated. Ruptured cylinders may rocket. May polymerize violently when heated or involved in a fire. Runoff may create fire or explosion hazard.
HEALTH AND ENVIRONMENT	Gas may cause dizziness and drowsiness. High concentration of gas may cause asphyxiation without warning. Contact with vaporizing liquid causes frostbite even through normal gloves. Gas is heavier than air and will collect in low or confined areas (drains, basements, tanks).

PROTECTIVE CLOTHING

EMERGENCY RESPONDERS	Wear SCBA and fully-encapsulating, gas-tight suit. If there is a risk of explosion or fire, then a fully-encapsulating, gas-tight suit should not be worn. Structural firefighters' uniform may provide limited protection. Always wear thermal protective clothing when handling liquid and associated equipment.
