**HAZARDS**

<b>FIRE</b>	<p>May be ignited by heat, sparks or flame.</p> <p>Vapours may form explosive mixtures with air.</p> <p>Vapours may travel to source of ignition and flash back.</p> <p>Containers may explode when heated.</p> <p>Fire may produce irritating or poisonous gases.</p> <p>Vapours from runoff may create an explosion hazard.</p>
<b>HEALTH AND ENVIRONMENT</b>	<p>May irritate or burn skin and eyes.</p> <p>Vapour may cause dizziness or drowsiness.</p> <p>Liquids may be lighter than water.</p> <p>Most vapours are heavier than air and will spread along the ground and collect in low or confined areas (drains, basements, tanks).</p> <p>Runoff from fire control or dilution water may pollute waterways.</p> <p>Ventilate enclosed spaces before entering.</p>

**PROTECTIVE CLOTHING**

<b>EMERGENCY RESPONDERS</b>	SCBA and structural firefighters' uniform may provide limited protection.
