FOREWORD

This Standard was prepared by the Association's Committee on Fire-resistant Doorsets, following a request from the Fire-door Manufacturers. AS 1905, *SAA Fire Door Code*, Part 1: *Fire-resistant doorsets*, specifies a logbook to be provided by the manufacturers upon completion of the doorset installation. The purpose of the logbook is to enable the subsequent maintenance of the fire-resistant doorsets installation to be documented in accordance with AS 1851, *Maintenance of fire protection equipment*, Part 7: *Fire-resistant doorsets*.

This Australian Standard logbook complies with the relevant requirements of AS 1905.1, and provides an alternative to the logbooks prepared by the manufacturers. It should be read in conjunction with AS 1905.1.

This Standard logbook, shall be readily available to the Inspecting Authority. It shall be maintained in good order and kept within the building to which it refers, in one of the following locations:

- (a) With the Building Manager or Security Guard.
- (b) In a specially constructed openable cabinet in the entrance or foyer which is clearly designated 'FIRE-RESISTANT DOORSET LOGBOOK'.
